



Laser Hair Removal

Laser hair removal results in a **permanent hair reduction** after 6 to 12 treatments. Price listed is for a package of 6 treatments per **one** area.

Benefits

- Long-term results – Most patients experience permanent hair reduction after 6–12 treatments.
- May improve certain skin conditions, including:
 - Acne
 - Hidradenitis suppurativa
 - Shaving bumps (pseudofolliculitis barbae)
 - Folliculitis
- Reduces irritation, ingrown hairs, and the need for frequent shaving or waxing.

Treatment Expectations

- Results vary based on hair color, skin type, hair thickness, and hormones.
- Light blonde, red, gray, and white hair respond poorly to laser treatment.
- Multiple sessions are required for best results.
- Complete hair removal is not guaranteed – the expected outcome is permanent hair reduction.

Risks & Possible Side Effects

- Temporary discomfort, redness, or swelling after treatment.
- Changes in skin pigment (dark or light spots) – usually temporary, rarely permanent.
- Burns, blistering, or scarring (rare).
- Paradoxical hypertrichosis (rare, uncommon increased hair growth in nearby untreated areas).
- Eye injury risk if protective eyewear is not worn.
- Some patients may require occasional touch-up treatments every few years.

Contraindications

- Laser hair removal may not be suitable if you:
 - Are pregnant or breastfeeding.
 - Have a history of keloid scarring or skin cancers in the treatment area.
 - Have an active skin infection or open wounds in the treatment area.

Pre-Treatment Instructions

- Avoid tanning (sun or tanning beds) for 4–6 weeks before treatment.
- Shave or trim the area 24 hours prior (do not wax, pluck, or thread for several weeks beforehand).
- Inform your provider if you take photosensitizing medicines or have a history of cold sores.

Post-Treatment Instructions

- Redness or swelling is normal and should resolve in 1–3 days.
- Avoid sun exposure, hot tubs, or vigorous exercise for 24–48 hours.
- Use daily sunscreen (SPF 30+) on treated areas exposed to sunlight.
